**Compound area -** A huge thank you to Greg and Rebecca from Hooper Contracting for preparing the area behind the caretakers shed. A number of huge truckloads of soil, tree stumps and debris were removed before the hardfill was laid down. This area will soon be fenced off to create a lockable area where items that should not be accessible to the students or the general public can be stored



**AV system in the hall** - I am pleased to let you know that the ageing and faulty AV system in the hall will be replaced with a modern system

**Roof-** As part of a much bigger roofing project, the leaking staffroom roof will be patched over the July school holidays to ensure the buildings are watertight until the major roofing project that will likely be scheduled for Jan 2023.

**Carpark fence-** Our next school funded project is to replace the dilapidated fence that runs along the railway line with a 6ft deer type fence and do some sort of remedial work to the carpark surface. The fence itself is not technically difficult but as we will be working within the rail corridor there are a few permits that need to be sorted before work can begin.

Games using Cards, are a super easy and fun way to practice Maths at Home.




Play Go Fish for pairs of two cards that add to 10.

Play **Builders paradise** to practice number sequencing.


Use Order of Operations to get to 24
