### Messages from Mr Roberts

# Keep Thursday 1st December clear in your calendar because it is Show Time!

Our current integrated unit is all about the performing arts. To celebrate all of our learning we will be hosting a school show on Thursday 1st December in the school hall. It is likely that to enable all of our school community to see the show there will need to be a matinee show



during the day and then a show after school. More details will be coming out in the coming weeks.



In the coming days and weeks you will see a new media campaign called Every School Day Is A Big Day. This campaign is all about highlighting the importance of regular attendance at school, as well as reengaging some whanau after all of the disruption that Covid-19 laid upon normal daily life. The goal is to have all students attending school at least 90% of the time, or in other words- at least 9 days out of every fortnight as a minimum. As I have mentioned in previous newsletters, one day a fortnight off school equates to 1.3 full years away from school if a student was to stay in school to Year 13.

The MoE provided all NZ schools with comprehensive attendance data. At Tua Marina School we do appear to have lots of room for improvement around our attendance levels.

During Term 2 of 2021 we had 80% of our ākonga (learners) attending school at least 90% of the time. Last term this figure fell to 22% of students attending school at least 90% of the time.

I acknowledge that this is a difficult space to navigate as in one breath we are asking whānau to keep their tamariki home if they are unwell, and in another breath we are saying that we have to improve our attendance rates.

Reporting and communicating attendance will become a regular part of what the school reports to whānau and we will be working closely with whānau and other agencies to support our ākonga to attend school regularly.

Next week I will be travelling with the Marlborough School Principals to Kaikoura for the Marlborough Principals Association AGM, and then onto Christchurch for the New Zealand Primary Principals Conference. There is an incredible list of speakers and workshops on offer and I am looking forward to being inspired, learning something new and bringing this back to our cool little school.

Slippery Sid By Frank And Jaiden


Sid the sloth slides on the slippery surface


