This week all schools across New Zealand received the funding and staffing entitlement notices for 2023. This year's notices took a bit of working through as it is the first year that the new targeted funding index has replaced the old decile system.

Staffing and funding entitlements are adjusted each year to reflect the predicted number of students that will be at each school. After a couple of years of large numbers of Year 8 students moving off to college, and smaller numbers of 5 year olds living in Tua Marina School's zone and starting school, we are facing a reduction in both funding and staffing next year. To enable the BoT to plan for the future we need the most accurate information about who will be at the school next year. If you know, or even think, that you are moving out of the area please contact the school office to let us know so we can make the best decisions for all learners and staff at Tua Marina School.


