This recommendation does not include any situation where mask wearing might not be practicable, such as while eating and drinking, playing certain musical instruments, indoor sport, where it will have a significant impact on teaching and learning (for example, students with particular learning needs), certain activities such as singing or drama performance on stage, and PE. In these situations, particular attention should be paid to ensuring there is good ventilation during the activity, and physical distancing where practicable. While we do ask that students bring a mask from home, we do have a generous supply of masks available at the school.

Broken record time.

Students who are dropped off at school at the beginning of the day should not be on the school grounds until 8.30am. We are unable to provide safe supervision for students who get dropped off before this time. We also ask that students who are collected at the end of the day are collected by 3.05pm. Students are more than welcome to stay and play at school if they are supervised by a parent or caregiver.
