Year 5 - 6 Julian Mason

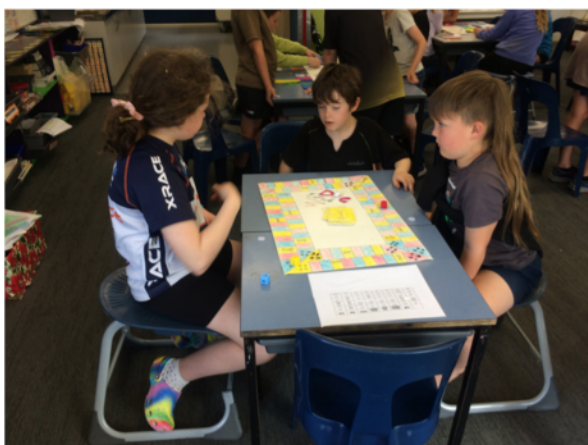
Kia ora e te whānau,
