
See you all next week ready for a big snow day and some more fun learning.

#### **Conflict Resolution**

This week we're moving on to learning about conflict resolution. This will include exploring ideas about what conflict *means*. One of the things that can help us with conflict resolution, is when we understand what can *cause* conflict, and what the *early signs* are.

Why not talk about this at home?

- \* How would you explain what 'conflict' means to someone younger than you that doesn't know? Can you give an example?
- What are some signs that might tell us that a conflict is about to happen?
   What might you notice? (e.g., what might you see or hear or feel?)
- When was a time you saw or experienced conflict this week? What are some things you can do to help manage or resolve it?
- What are some strategies you can use when you need to calm down when you are starting to feel cross or during conflict?



A wonderful way to get the kids out of the house and teach the importance of compassion and dedication.


- -Chicks are sold in units-each unit contains 4 chicks @\$38 per unit.
