

Starting around 9.30am this morning, Friday 17th Nov, Manaia & Willem's Uncle Brendon is beginning his amazing challenge and adventure of cycling from Cape Reinga to Stirling Point in Bluff in 4 days. This is approx 2000kms in the seat!

He is aiming to beat the current NZ Record, which is 4 days, 9 hours and 45 mins, and is currently held by Marlborough Endurance Athlete Craig Harper.

At this stage, Brendon is planning on flying via helicopter from Wellington to Queen Charlotte College, then coming through Tua Marina very early Sunday morning.

If you would like to get out and support him, he can be tracked in real time via the <u>Trackme NZ</u> website. It would be a huge boost to see and hear people cheer him on along the way!
