We are working with KiwiRail currently to build a fence along the rail corridor. We are hoping to start construction very soon.

Our school's value system has been reviewed and now we can announce what we have reset it with, our four values moving forward will be: Community, Active Involvement, Learning, Manaakitanga The next step is to define each of these terms clearly and concisely so that we can all be singing off the same page, then work with the students to state the behaviours we would see in various contexts if we were showing these.

Please make sure everyone brings a water bottle to school. Water bottles can stay at school for the week.




Julian Mason - Year 5 - 6









Kowhai
